

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS TO ALLOW SNOW TO REMAIN ON SIDE-WALKS IN FRONT OF THEIR PLACES OF BUSINESS, IN THE BUSINESS SECTION OF SOMERSET, KENTUCKY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS OF ITS PROVISIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Board of Council of the City of Somerset, Kentucky, as follows:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation having an establishment in the business section of Somerset, Kentucky, to allow an accumulation of snow to remain on the side-walks fronting their business, after the snow has ceased, and they shall immediately remove the snow from said walks, after a snow storm has ceased, and at all times during the winter season keep said walks free from snow.

2. Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms and provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction be fined in a sum of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifteen Dollars, and each day snow shall remain on side-walks fronting their business shall be a separate offense.

3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall become in full force and effect on and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
