Somerset Police Activity for Memorial Day Weekend 2011

Somerset police stayed busy during the 2011 Memorial Day weekend.

Patrol officers responded to 371 calls for service between 6:00 PM Friday and midnight Monday night. That number reflects 62 more calls than officers answered during the same holiday period last year.

Officers made 15 criminal arrests, down from 28 in 2010. Three people were arrested for DUI and 6 were arrested on drug charges.

Also on the decline this year were non-injury automobile collisions. There was only one injury collision and only 4 non-injury accidents within the city.

Several of the arrests this holiday weekend related to previous criminal cases.

James Pike, age 45, of Sycamore Street, was arrested early Saturday morning on a Pulaski Circuit Court Indictment charging him with Criminal Abuse 1st Degree and Sexual Abuse 1st Degree. Sgt. Greg Martin arrested Pike at Pulaski County Park at 1:39 AM. His wife, Alvena, was arrested and lodged on May 18 on similar charges. The investigation showed that between July and December 2010, James committed sexual and criminal abuse to the couple's children. Alvena is charged with Complicity to Commit Sexual Abuse 1st Degree and four counts of Criminal Abuse 1st Degree by planning, promoting, counseling, or aiding James Pike.

Tina Adler, 29, of Mt. Vernon, Ky. was arrested on May 31 in Rockcastle County on an outstanding Pulaski Circuit Court Indictment charging her with Engaging in Organized Crime. Adler was part of a theft ring indicted for stealing meat and other merchandise from local businesses and selling to other retail establishments in March 2011. The Pulaski County Sheriff Department assisted in the arrest.
