Mr. Beasley moved to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting held on December 8, 2003 and the reports be approved as delivered. Mr. New seconded the motion. Upon roll call the following Council Members voted "Aye": Mrs. Norfleet, Mr. Floyd, Mr. Wheeldon, Mr. Beasley, Mr. New, Mrs. Hunley, Mr. Minton, Mr. Owens, Mr. Bourne, and Mr. Burnett.

Second reading was given the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 03- 11

ESTABLISHING THE "PRIDE SPECIAL SERVICE AREA NO. 1"

WHEREAS failing septic tanks and other on-site wastewater disposal systems along the U.S. 27, south corridor are creating non-point source pollution of Lake Cumberland, and

WHEREAS such discharges are a threat to the health and safety of Somerast Pulnski County residents and visitors, and

WHEREAS failing wastewater systems jeopardize the safety and reliability of the Somerset Water Treatment Plant, the primary provider of potable water to the

WHEREAS the City of Someraet desires to make sanitary sewer service available to allow the abandonment of such failing systems and to provide wastewater service to the corridor along U.S. 27 south thus preventing the continue condition conditions to devide to development.

WHEREAS the area of initial wastewater service area shall be along the U.S. 27 highway south, from near Horseahoe Road to near the Somerset Water Triathway. Be if hirther known that sunitary sever system design for this critical area will be such as to ultimately accept all waste low south of the Water.

WHEREAS the City of Somerant hereby catabilishes this area as "PRID' SPPCIAL SERVICE AREA NUMBER 1", and establishes a system of capits recovery herea to support construction of and wastewate facilities.

WHEREAS the primary beneficiaries of the proposed system are deemed to be owners of property fronting on U.S. 27, south served by the project. Said beneficiaries shall be assessed a "capital recovery" for based upon an estimated local share cost of \$300,000.00. Capital recovery assessment has been calculated to be \$29,95 per front foot of such properties, but may be adjusted as necessary after receipt of project construction bid and other project costs. Be it known that the City of Somerset Water Treatment Facilities possess approximately 1,071 [leges feet of fronties and shall contribute its share in the amount \$32,075.47.


Be it further known that in the event that benefiting property owners fail to pay their 'capital recovery' assessment, such costs may be loamed by the City to assure project construction. The total amount loamed to the project by the City shall not exceed \$80,000,00. In the case of any such project loans, the City of Somerset shall file all for assistant any such monety was drecovery all loan costs as a surcharge added to benefiting property owner's monthly rewer bill. Principal amount of such surcharge shall be the delinquent amount of the original eassessment plus filing and proceasing costs and shall be interest at the rate of 10 percent per annum. The term over which such surcharge shall be levied shall be severed to the processing costs.


WHEREAS it is understood that the City of Someraet shall fully own and operate said "PRIDE SPECIAL SERVICE AREA NUMBER 1" wastewnier transportation system and the subject users of some to monthly use charges on the basis of current and periodically adjusted rates for 'outside' customers.

Whereas, the City of Somerset shall extend the U.S. 27, south newer project from time to time as if sees fit to further reduce pollution from on-site disposal systems and/or to enhance the development potential of the service area. Capital recovery assessments may or may not be levied in such cases, depending upon

This *PRIDE Special Service Area Number 1* shall continue as a separate part of the Somerset westewater system until changed by the City of Somerset's duly sented Council.




