## Purchase of Glock Model 22

We request to modify/change the vendor for the purchase of the Glock model 22 for the Somerset Police Department. We are asking that we purchase the Glock handgens from Bluegram Indoor Range based in Louisville, Kentucky.

After considerable talks with Glock lac. (the original vendor) and Bloograss Indoor Range, it was determined that a mintak had been made in Bloograss Indoor Range's bids. In their first bid someone had inserveriently put in that bid that all trade-in weapons would be happered on delivery and the trade is price may be ediguated at that time. The owner of Bloograss Indoor Range, Who Underwood, has assured us that there would not be any adjustments on the trade-in values and has archaetted as we quot to refrect us only determine to intrade-in value.

Bluegrass indoor Range's quets for the new wrapons at \$429.00 each is less than Glock line, quote of \$434.00 each. The trade-in allowance from Bluegrams Indoor Range at \$246.00 per weapon is more than Glock line, quote of \$246.50 per weapon. This will be a savings of \$4.50 per upon with a tutal of \$240.50 for the cutter to purchase

We have also talked with Glock Inc. District Manage why? Glock Inc. kas advised us that the weapons are ready for shipment as soon as they get anthorization and a request from Bluegrass Indoor Range.
