The Common Council of the City of Somerset, Kentucky met in regular session on Monday, May 22, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. with the following present: Mayor JP Wiles. Mr. Burnett moved to approve the water park employee's handbook, approval of discount admission rates after 4:00 pm, and early closure due to low attendance. Mr. Floyd seconded the motion. ## RESOLUTION NO. 06-05

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A LEASE FOR THE FINANCING OF A PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF VARIOUS DOCUMENTS RELATED TO SUCH LEASE.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Somerset, Kennicky (the "Lessee") has the power, pursuant to Section 65 940 at sag, of the Kennicky Revised Statutes to enter into one or more lease agreements with or without the option to purchase in order to provide for the use of property for multic numrower.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Lessee (the "Cloverning Body") has previously determined, and hereby further determines, that the Lessee is in need of the Project, as defined in the Lesse:

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined and bereby determines that it is in the best interests of the Lessee that the Lessee and the Keraucky Area Development Districts Financing Trust (the "Lessee") enter into a Lesse Agreement (the "Lessee") for the learning by the Lessee from the Lessor of the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED AND RESULVED BY THE COUNSEL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSEL, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

Section 1. <u>Recitals and Authorization</u>. The Lessec hereby approves the Lesse Agreement (the "Lease") and all Collateral Documents, as defined in the Lease, each in substantially the form presented to this Governing Body. It is hereby found and determined that the Project identified in the Lease is public property to be used for public purposes. It is finder determined that it is necessary and desimble and in the best interests of the Lease to enter into the Lease for the purposes therein specified, and the execution and delivery of the Lease and all representations, certifications and other maners contained in the Closing Memorandum with respect to the Lease, or a may be required by the Lesser prior to delivery of the Lease, are hereby approved, radified and confirmed. The Mayor and City Clerk of the Lease can be reby authorized to accent the Lease, together with such other agreements or certifications which may be necessary to accomplish the transaction contemplated by the Lease.

Section 2. Purpose. The City plans to use the proceeds of the lease to purchase one (1) truck from Worldwide Equipment for use by the City.

Section 3. Investment of Funds. Ross, Sinclaire & Associates, LLC, as Prugram Administrator, is hereby authorized to direct the Trustec to invest funds on deposit under the Leaue in such manner, subject to all legal limitations, as will, in the Program Administrator's judgement, produce the most Evocable financial result for the Lessee.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 5. Sunshing Law. This Governing Body hereby funds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Governing Body, and that all deliberations of this governing Body and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements.

Section 6. <u>Conflicts.</u> All resolutions, orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and the provisions of this Resolution shall prevail and be given effect.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its passage, as
