#### RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL FUNDING/AGREEMENTS RELATING TO THE WATER INTAKE EMERGENCY PROJECT PREVIOUSLY AUTHORIZED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSET AND AS AN EMERGENCY AS DECLARED BY THE GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS, the City of Somerset in conjunction with the Kentucky Office of Local Government, State of Kentucky, has previously approved resolutions declaring the water intake project to be an emergency and authorizing funding/grant agreements and implementation; and

WHEREAS, the low bid/proposal for the construction of said project is \$1,837,016 for construction only with a total project cost of approximately \$ 2,100,000;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Somerset does hereby authorize the Amendments to any and all agreements/resolutions/grant conditions with the Kentucky Office of Local Development (GOLD) to allow additional grants to be approved and applications submitted for funding; to approve any and all ioans pertaining to the water intake project that may be necessary in addition to any/or all grants; and to authorize implementation and execution of all documents necessary for the successful completion of the project.

# ORDINANCE NO. <u>07-0</u>7

AN ORDINANCE TO THE CITY OF SOMERSET, KENTUCKY, ADOPTING A CROSS-CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM FOR THE PREVENTION OF CROSS-CONNECTION CONTAMINATION,

WHEREAS, THE KENTUCKY NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION CABINET HAVE ENACTED ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS, OIL NAM \$200, WHICH REQUIRE EVERY PUBLIC WATER SYSTEM TO DETERMINE IF OR WHERE CROSS CONNECTIONS EXIST AND TO ELIMINATE TILEM: AND

WHEREAS, THE COMMON COUNCIL OF SOMERSET REALIZE THAT THEY HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH BY PROVIDING A SAFE SOURCE OF DERINKING WATER, AND THAT CROSS CONNECTIONS COULD AFFECT THE HEALTH AND ECONOMIC GROWTH OF THE

THEREFORE, THE FOLLOWING IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOMERSET PURSUANT TO THE CITY'S POWER LINDER APR 52 082 AND KRS 65 01:

(A) The purpose of this section is to eliminate potential threats to the health and safety of those served by the city's public water supply, both residential and non-residential, out to cross-connection contamination and/or backflow. The City recognizes the contamination of the public water supply presents an imminent health hazard to the residential and non-residential waters of the public vater system, a threat of significant economic loss due to disrupted water service to water users, and potential liability of the City.

(B) This ordinance and program hereby establishes reasonable precautions to protect the public water system from cross-connection containstation due to backflow that may originate from a customer a connection to the city's water system. Said backflow could result in a degrading of the quality of water in the city's system due to contamination of the water with substances, including but not limited to, medical waste, toxic materials, and hazardous industrial substances. The program will regulate cross-connections with both commercial and residential accounts where there is a threat of such substances contaminating the water system, including but not limited to, commercial, industrial, laws irrigation, and fire service systems.

(C) There is hereby adopted with the ordinance a Cross-Connection Control Program Manual containing requirements and definitions for the program, made part hereof and incorporated in full by reference, said manual being available for review by the public in the Someract City Clerk's Office upon request. (D) The determination of whether a changes and/or a cross-connection mechanism is necessary on a customer's account will be made by the City of Somerset Water Service Department according to the referred to Cross-Connection Control Proparam Manual. Any account, whether residential, commercial, or industrial, in which the City Water Service Department deems to be a potential bazard will be required to the account, whether the control to the control to the control backflow prevention mechanism. Said mechanism subor'd changes will be required to be completed within 60 days of the date the determination is made by the City Water Service Department. The customer shall base all costs of the required changes and/or installation, as well as all costs related to the maintenance of a control mechanism and any required testing of any cross-connection control device required by the City. This program and ordinance shall apply to new residential, commercial, and industrial customers; former customers whose are te-connecting, and current customer connections.

(E) If any of this Ordinance is deemed by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall
