

RESOLUTION CANCELLING AGREEMENT WITH PULASKI COUNTY REGARDING EMS NOW THEREFORE, the City hereby gives a sixty (60) notice of termination of the EMS Agreeme with the County and consistent with a previous Resolution authorizing securing repayment of underfunding of \$982,097 through June 30, 2012 with FY 2013 not yet determined. March 11, 2013 WHEREAS, the 1995 <u>Agreement</u> between the City of Somerset and Pulassi County concerning th overseeing or management of the emergency medical services (EMS) by Somerset City Council is no longer practical or effective nor consistent with current laws and regulations; and I ADDITION, the City will retain all current licenses for emergency services and reserves the ght to continue, but not limited to, advanced life support (ALS), basic life support (BLS), medica supportation and other services within the city limits of Somerset as a supplement to the continue, but not limited to, advanced life suppo rtation and other services within the city limits of vices provided to all residents of the county. WHEREAS, the Pulaski County Fiscal Court has openly refused to acknowledge revenue si or operating deficit or the County's financial obligation to meet said shortfall and openly indicated in a Fiscal Court meeting that the contract is not valid, and auditory Casp -WHEREAS, the City has made known to the County on March 1, 2011, meeting with county officials in 2011, December 21, 2012, January 14, 2013, meeting with county officials on January 31, City Resolutions on February 13, 2013 (copy sent to county). Occupational Tax Ordinance on February 28, 2013 (copy provided to county) about the actual and projected financial shortfall for EMS; and WHEREAS, the City has offered on at least two recent meetings to transfer the operation of the EMS to the County but received no response; and WHEREAS, the Mayor has no authority to go outside city limits for EMS without an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement or basic form of Agreement; and WHEREAS, the City Council would need to approve a Budget Amendment in addition to the emergency funds advanced to EMS by City Resolution and an identification of the source of funds for the budget amendment; and WHEREAS, every citizen of Somerset is a resident of Pulaski County and pays double taxat for that privilege and any EMS services provided by the County must be available to every citizen of Somerset thereby giving Somerset citizens emergency services.

Mr. Mitchell moved to approve the following Resolution No. 13-07 entering into a interlocal cooperation agreement with UNITE. Mr. T. Eastham seconded the motion. Upon roll call the following Council Members voted "Aye": Mr. Wheeldon, Mr. J. Eastham, Mr. Girdler, Mr. New, Mrs. Hunley, Mr. Minton, Jim Mitchell, Mr. Bourne, Mr. Burnett, Mr. T. Eastham, Mr. Rutherford, and Mrs. Stringer.



Mr. Burnett moved to transfer ownership of a closed right of way on University Drive in the amount of \$1.00 to First Apostolic Church for additional parking and building. Mr. Wheeldon seconded the motion. Upon roll call the following Council Members voted "Aye": Mr. Wheeldon, Mr. J. Eastham, Mr. Girdler, Mr. New, Mrs. Hunley, Mr. Minton, Jim Mitchell, Mr. Bourne, Mr. Burnett, Mr. T. Eastham, Mr. Rutherford, and Mrs. Stringer.
