RESOLUTION 4-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SOMERSET, KENTUCKY, TO DEDICATE THE CITY STREET COMMONLY AND LEGALLY KNOWN AS "SECOND STREET" IN HONOR OF J.S. NEW, SAID STREET BEING LOCATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF SOMERSET;

WHEREAS, the City of Somerset, Kentucky, by and through the City Council, wishes to honor Mr. J.S. New, a Pulaski County and Somerset resident, for his love and dedication to his Neighborhood, City, and County; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby wishes to dedicate the street commonly and legally known as "Second Street" to Mr. J.S. New, said roadway in its entirety running North to South from Elrod Street to Adams Street, and said roadway being located within the corporate boundaries of the City of Somerset;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved and ordained by the Common Council of the City of Somerset, Kentucky this 9th day of June, 2014, that:

- I. That the City hereby dedicates "Second Street" as described above to Mr. J.S. New, and hereafter shall be known by the public as "J.S. New Street", though the legal addresses shall remain as Second Street for purposes of property identification, 911 regulations, and postal regulations; and
- II. That this Dedication is to be in the form of signage provided by the City of Somerset, and properly located on said street in accordance with local and KY State Highway Department regulations, and all other applicable law; and
- III. That the Council wishes to acknowledge that a ceremony will be held at which said street will be officially dedicated to Mr. J.S. New in order that his family, friends, and the community can share in the Dedication of said street; and
- IV. That this resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage by the common council and according to law.
