SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 26-05

The Communications Services Committee proposes to amend the following sections of the City Code to:

1. General provisions

COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE means the transmission of information or signals by a system of any other means. Communications services include, but are not limited to, telephone, mobile phone, internet service, television, video, video-on-demand, broadcast, satellite, cable service, video programming, wireless, data, group, wireless, service, and related services. The term "communications services" shall not include any other service provided by a utility or other entity.
